Topic: Police-Reported Violent Crimes, 2018

Released by Statistics Canada, December 13, 2019

Background: In 2018, the number of police-reported victims of violent crime in Nunavut was **2,980.** As is the case with violent crime overall, the territories have consistently recorded the highest rates of police-reported violence against women. The rate of violent crime against women in Nunavut (**10,325** per 100,000 females) was nearly **10** times higher than the rate for Canada.
