Topic: Youth Correctional Services

2018/2019

Released by Statistics Canada – October 15, 2020

**Background:** In 2018/2019, the total number of youth admissions to correctional

services in Nunavut, was **39** admissions **down** by **50.6%** from 2017/2018. Admissions to custody went **down 76.5%**, while admissions to community

supervision decreased by 35.0%.
